

## **I What to Bring – “Uh-oh, I forgot my...”:**

- Blanket OR sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Swim suit/clothing to swim in
- Towel(s); maybe one for showering and another towel to use for the beach
- Extra clothing for Monday-Thur
- Personal items/toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothpaste, etc.)
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- “Tennis” shoes (+ sandals, flip flops, etc.)
- Any necessary (and legal) medicine
- Light jacket (in case it’s cool at night or the morning)
- Entertainment of any sort (board games, card games, soccer ball, guitars, etc)
- Do NOT bring tobacco, drugs or alcohol. They are not permitted at the camp
- Flashlight or use your phone’s flashlight
- Phone chargers

## **II. What to Expect – “Don’t Be Surprised”:**

- Sleeping arrangement:
  - We won’t have our own individual rooms or cabins. Men will be sleeping in a building together on cots. Women will have similar arrangements in a separate building on the camp grounds.



- Activities
  - One day, we'll go explore Savannah. We'll do some things together and separately; but go back to the camp ALL TOGETHER at a designated time.
  - One day, likewise, we'll go to Tybee Island. We'll enjoy the beach, walking on the pier over the ocean and anyone that would like to walk up the light house is welcome
- Discussion
  - Each night, after dinner, we'll hear from the Bible. The theme of our discussions and reading will be about this topic: What is truly life giving in this life? What is meant to sustain us and give us meaning?)
  - Even though we'll be reading from the Bible, we don't expect that everyone will agree with or believe what it teaches. However, we believe it's filled with truth about how life is meant to be. So, we'll spend time dissecting and learning from different passages about what Jesus says concerning some of these questions.
- SAFETY:
  - This is a trip that is designed to help all of us to have fun and enjoy time together. At night, no one will be allowed to leave the camp.
  - Even though we're all adults, this is not a trip for everyone to do their own thing. RUFİ is responsible for the safety of everyone that comes with us, but we can't do that if students are planning separate outings/trips without the whole group or an RUFİ staff/volunteer.
